History of the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band

Zanesville has a long and rich band history dating back to 1820, when Charles Hill formed the first reed and string band. Throughout the 1800s, numerous bands thrived in the community, the most notable of which was the Bauer Band. Led by John Bauer, the Bauer Band flourished between the mid-1800s and early 1900s and was well-known throughout Ohio, as well as neighboring states. Notable high-profile performances of the Bauer Band include the opening of the suspension bridge in Wheeling in 1849 and the funeral of Ohio-born Civil War General William Sherman in St. Louis in 1891. After John Bauer died in 1912, the Bauer Band was taken over by the American Rolling Mill Company and renamed the Armco Band. During this time, the 7th Regiment Band, part of the 7th Ohio Volunteer Infantry, Spanish-American War, was also active in Zanesville and was the chief rival of the Armco Band. It was the merging of the Armco Band and the 7th Regiment bands in 1923 that created the Memorial Band. This new Memorial Band was formed to play summer concerts in Zanesville that were funded by bequests of Eaton S. Drone and John Hoge. These early concerts took place twice weekly, in McIntire Park and Putnam Hill Park. Over the last 100 years, the Memorial Band has performed hundreds, if not thousands, of free concerts for the Zanesville community at various locations throughout the city, including several of the city's parks, the Helen Purcell Home, the Muskingum County Home, the Muskingum County Fairgrounds, Memorial Hall, Zane Trace Commemoration, and the banks of the Muskingum River. Notable out-of-town performances of the Memorial Band include an appearance at the Ohio State Fair in 1932 and a concert in 1943 for wounded veterans at Fletcher General Hospital in Cambridge, a hospital built by the U.S. Army during World War II to serve the war's sick and wounded service men and women. The current home of the Memorial Band is Zane's Landing Park, where it has performed since the mid-1980s, with support from the City of Zanesville. With a vision for passing along the community band tradition to future generations, the Memorial Band launched a high school honors band program in 2005. The honors band is comprised of select area high school students and traditionally performs on the first concert of the season. The Memorial Band continues to receive support from the Eaton S. Drone and John Hoge funds, in addition to other local grant sources. These grants and the generosity of individual and business patrons allow the Memorial Band to enthusiastically fulfill its primary mission—to provide free summer concerts to the Zanesville community.

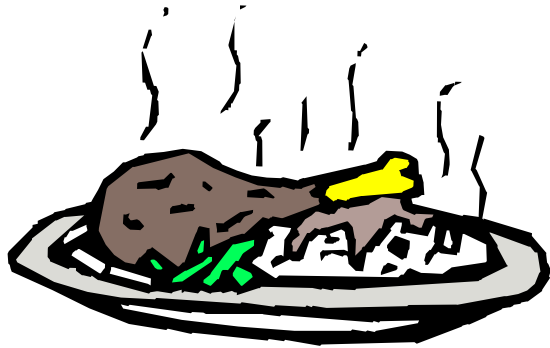

**Form New Memorial Band;
First Concert is Tonight**

**Forty Men Under Direction of
Paul Kern Will Compose
Organization**

A Drone and Hoge Memorial Concert band has been organized in this city for the purpose of giving a higher standard of music at the outdoor concerts as provided for by the wills of the late Eaton Drone and John Hege.

The band is composed of 40 of Zanesville's most skilled musicians, selected from the Musicians union. The new band will be under the leadership of Paul Kern, who has proved his ability to interpret standard selections as well as popular

numbers by his work with the Grotto band, which took second place in the national contest held Wednesday in Cleveland.

The concerts will be given under the direction of the park board and it is the intention to give them all summer. The concerts will be held each Thursday evening in McIntire park on each Sunday afternoon in Putnam Hill park.

The park board believes that the people will approve increasing the band from 20 to 40 men and the selection of each man for his ability as a performer on his particular instrument.

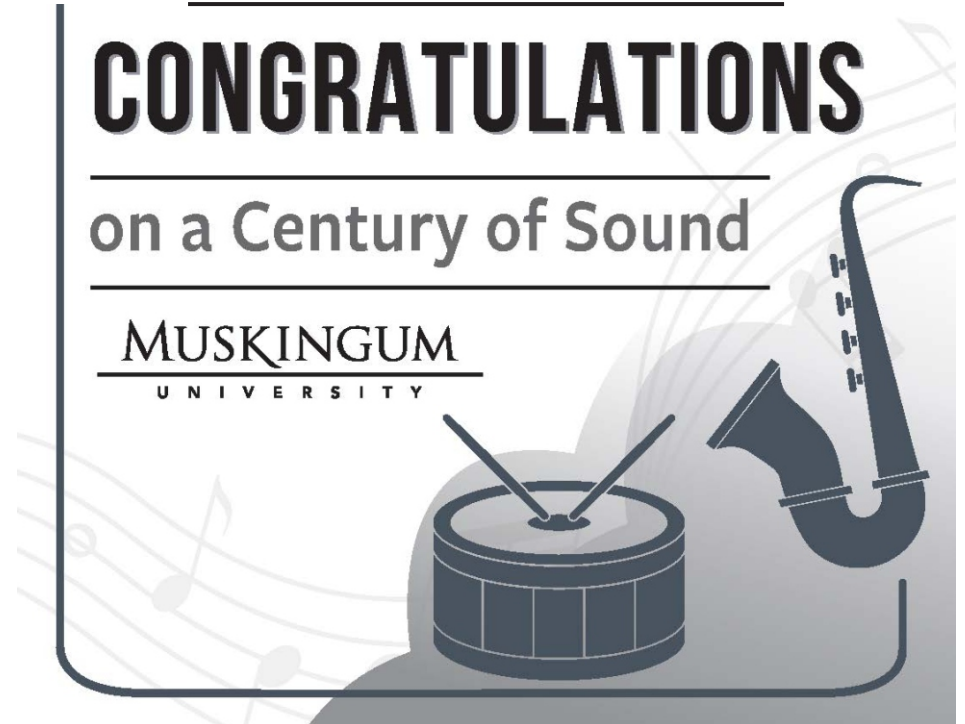

The first concert will be given in McIntire park this evening at 7:30 o'clock. It will last for two hours and the residents of this city are looking forward with much pleasure to the opening of the old door musical season which has always been so enjoyable here since its inception.

MEET OUR GUEST CONDUCTOR/COMPOSER

Brian Balmages

Brian Balmages is known worldwide as a composer and conductor who equally spans the worlds of orchestral, band, and chamber music. His music has been performed by groups ranging from professional symphony orchestras to elementary schools in venues such as Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, Sydney Opera House, Toronto Centre for the Arts, and many more. He is a recipient of the A. Austin Harding Award from the American School Band Directors Association, won the 2020 NBA William Revelli Composition Contest with his work "Love and Light", and was awarded the inaugural James Madison University Distinguished Alumni Award from the School of Visual and Performing Arts. In the same year, he was commissioned by his other alma mater, the University of Miami, to compose music for the inauguration of the institution's 6th president, Dr. Julio Frenk. His music was also performed as part of the 2013 Presidential Inauguration Prayer Service, which was attended by both President Obama and Vice President Biden.

As a conductor, Mr. Balmages enjoys regular engagements with all-state and regional ensembles as well as university and professional groups throughout the world. Notable guest conducting appearances have included the Midwest Clinic, Western International Band Clinic, Maryborough Music Conference (Australia), College Band Directors Conference, American School Band Directors Association National Conference, numerous state ASTA conferences, Teatro dell'Aquila (Italy), and others. He is an elected member of the American Bandmasters Association and has taught instrumental conducting at Towson University where he also served as Assistant Director of Bands and Orchestras. Currently, he is Director of MakeMusic Publications and Digital Education for Alfred and MakeMusic.

ETERNAL FLAME

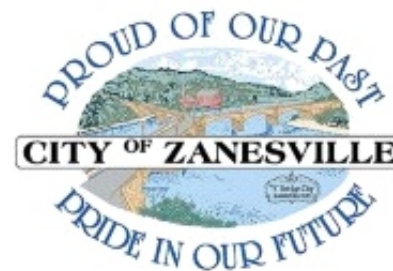

The band does a summer concert series at Zane's Landing Park, a beautiful outdoor venue. I soon learned that Zane's Landing Park is also home of Zanesville's Eternal Flame, the only eternal flame memorial in the United States

MEET OUR ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

Kelley Ryan

Mr. Kelley Ryan has served as the Assistant Director of the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band since 2016 or 2017. This fall he begins his 48th year directing bands for the Zanesville City Schools where he teaches grades 5 through 12. Mr. Ryan received a Bachelor of Music Degree from Muskingum College in 1975 and a Master of Music Degree from the University of Akron in 1980. He has also studied at the University of Virginia, Kent State University, Ohio University, Andrews University, and Ashland University. He has been an OMEA adjudicator since 1981 and served as the OMEA District IX treasurer for four years. More recently, he edited and revised the OMEA required solo lists for soprano, tenor, and baritone saxophones and for the Eb clarinet.

MEET OUR ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Dr. David A. Turrill

Dr. David A. Turrill has served as the Artistic Director of the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band since 2019. He is currently Associate Professor of Music and Director of Bands at Muskingum University, where he conducts the Muskingum University Wind Ensemble and Muskingum Valley Symphonic Winds. He also teaches courses in music education, conducting, music theory, and applied trumpet, in addition to supervising student teachers. A native of Marietta, Ohio, he earned a Bachelor of Music in music education from Ohio University; a Master of Music in conducting and trumpet performance from Ohio University; and a Doctor of Musical Arts in trumpet performance, with a cognate in wind conducting, from Michigan State University. Prior to joining the faculty at Muskingum, Dr. Turrill taught at Spring Arbor University (MI) and enjoyed twelve years of public-school teaching in southeast Ohio. Bands under his direction consistently earned superior ratings at regional and state adjudicated events. He is passionate about new repertoire for Wind Ensemble and has been involved in the commissioning of several works by leading composers, including Brian Balmages, Ryan Nowlin, John Mackey, Jake Runestad, Donald Grantham, and Giovanni Santos. Dr. Turrill's professional affiliations include membership in Pi Kappa Lambda music honor society, College Band Directors National Association, National Association for Music Education, Ohio Music Education Association, International Trumpet Guild, Ohio Private College Instrumental Conductors Association, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. Dr. Turrill is active as a band clinician for high schools in the region and has presented at state professional development conferences in Ohio and Iowa. A strong advocate for community-based music, Dr. Turrill is honored to be serving as Artistic Director during the centennial season of the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band.



dedicated to Medal of Honor recipients. Almost immediately, the concept of the piece came into focus.

The opening feels much like an Olympic fanfare, immediately invoking the heroic actions that often lead to a Medal of Honor, the highest military award for valor. While the piece is not overtly patriotic, it does include subtle nods to *America*, beginning with the lyrical, stately theme that occurs after the opening fanfare. As the music develops, various phrases from *America* continue to be referenced without there ever being a full setting of the theme.

The piece concludes with a restatement of the opening fanfare, this time in a completely different tempo and time signature, yet it feels remarkably similar to the opening. This is juxtaposed with a flurry of woodwind activity spilling over from the previous section, drawing everything together into a powerful conclusion.

It was an honor to be able to celebrate the 100th anniversary of this fine ensemble and also write music that pays tribute to the powerful memorial that resides in the very same park. The two share an important aspect: both continue to be lights that burn brightly and inspire those who visit Zane's Landing Park.
