ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

Mr. Ryan received a Bachelor of Music Degree from Muskingum College in 1975 and a Masters of Music Degree from the University of Akron in 1980. He has also studied at The University of Virginia, Kent State University, Ohio University, Andrews University and Ashland University. He has been an OMEA Adjudicator since 1981 and served as the OMEA District 9 treasurer for four years. More recently, he edited and revised the OMEA Required Solo lists for soprano, tenor, and baritone saxophones and for the Eb clarinet.

In August, Mr. Ryan will begin his 47th year directing bands for the Zanesville City School System where he teaches grades 5 through 12.

MEET OUR CONDUCTORS

Dr. David A. Turrill

ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Dr. David A. Turrill was appointed Artistic Director of the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band in 2019. He also serves as Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Music at Muskingum University, where he conducts the Muskingum University Wind Ensemble, the Muskingum Valley Symphonic Winds, and co-directs the Jazz Ensemble. His teaching responsibilities at Muskingum include teaching applied trumpet, conducting, courses in music education, and supervising student teachers. Dr. Turrill has maintained an active schedule as a guest conductor and clinician, and played trumpet in the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band from 2010 to 2018. A champion of new music, he has been involved in numerous commissioning projects, including works by composers John Mackey, Jake Runestad, Ryan Nowlin, Donald Grantham, Giovanni Santos, and Anthony Plog.

A native of Marietta, Ohio, Dr. Turrill earned the Bachelor of Music Education degree as well as Master of Music degrees in Conducting and Trumpet Performance from Ohio University. He earned the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Trumpet Performance, with a cognate in wind conducting, from Michigan State University. Prior to his appointment at Muskingum, Dr. Turrill was on the faculty at Spring Arbor University (MI) and performed regularly with the orchestras of Lansing, Grand Rapids, West Michigan, Battle Creek, Saginaw Bay, Jackson, and Livonia.

In addition to his university teaching experience, Dr. Turrill also has twelve years of public-school teaching experience as an elementary, middle school, and high school band director. His middle school and high school bands consistently earned superior ratings at regional and state adjudicated events. Dr. Turrill's professional affiliations include membership in Pi Kappa Lambda music honor society, the College Band Directors National Association, the National Association for Music Education, the Ohio Music Education Association, International Trumpet Guild, the Ohio Private College Instrumental Conductors Association, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia.

MEET OUR GUEST EUPHONIUM SOLOIST

Scott Heath

Scott Heath, a native of Lima, Ohio, and a 1986 graduate of Lima Shawnee High School, received a Bachelor of Music Education from The Ohio State University in 1990. While at Ohio State, he played baritone/euphonium in the Ohio State Marching Band, Symphonic Band, and Concert Band. He received a Master of Music in Solo Performance from Arizona State University in 1993. Upon returning to Ohio, he began teaching instrumental music and is in his 29th year of teaching in Central Ohio. Scott has been teaching in the Grandview Heights School District since 2000.

As a soloist, Scott has received 1st place in the Artist Division Solo Competition at the 1994 Rafeal Mendez Brass Institute in Phoenix, AZ, as well as first 1st place in the Artist Division Solo Competition at the 1995 International Tuba/Euphonium Conference in Chicago. He also won the Soloist of the Day award at the 1990 and 1995 North American Brass Band Competitions and the Technical Solo Division award at the 2000 North American Brass Band Competition in addition to being the semi-finalist for the Leonard Falcone International Euphonium Competition in 1989 and 1990.

Scott's has studied euphonium with Dr. Paul Droste, Professor Daniel Perantoni, and Dr. Brian Bowman. He has performed with The Brass Band of Columbus, The Dublin Silver Band, The Central Ohio Symphony, The Westerville Symphony, and the Central Ohio Brass Band.

The ZCMB - A Brief History

Zanesville flourished with performing arts activities in the late 1800's, and the John Bauer Band was among them. The band was organized before 1800 and averaged 15 to 20 members. When the band leader died in 1912, his ensemble was taken over by the American Rolling Mills Company and became known as the Armco Band.

The 7th Regiment and Armco bands held their concerts locally, in McIntire Park and Putnam Park. By 1923, the two bands had merged, taking the present day name of Zanesville Memorial Concert Band.

Today, funds for the concerts are raised by individual and corporate contributions. An endowment fund has also been established for anyone wishing to make a donation towards the ZMCB.

The band's current home is Zane's Landing Park, along the eastern banks of the Muskingum River in downtown Zanesville. Concerts are performed on five Sunday evenings through the summer.

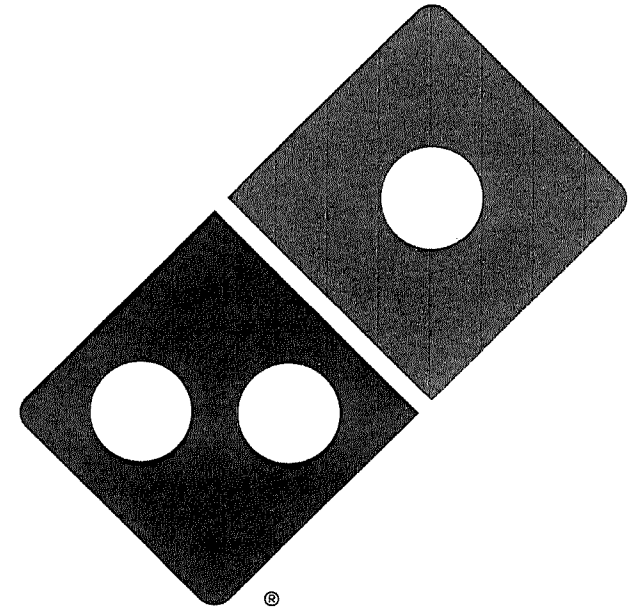
Concerts remain free to the public, thanks to the generosity of our supporters.
